Joseph Ritner Wollett Funeral 1890-1946

Many times we hear stories about certain events that with a little research the facts can shed light on the outcome. With the help of my daughter, Beth King, who found a number of old newspaper articles, I was able to get a few more facts surrounding the events of Mr. Wolletts's funeral and the collapse of the floor of the church that caused the renovation of the church.

The story goes as I heard it, that the crowd at the service was so large that the floor collapsed and this was instrumental in the eventual turning around of the sanctuary. J.R. Wollett was a very active member in his church, community, and town. He was a businessman, owning Wollett Lumber Company. It was a prosperous business; providing materials for new construction and jobs for the area. But also he was civic minded in that he served as mayor of Littleton from 1929 to 1931. Two different terms as a town commissioner. First from 1923 to 1929 and a second term that lasted from 1933 to 1946. Littleton Baptist Church benefited from his service as well. He was a member of a building committee, a deacon, and as church treasurer from 1920 until 1946. As important as town and church were, the state of North Carolina would benefit too. He was a member of the State Board of Conservation and Development until his death, where he earned the respect of many. Governor Robert Cherry after hearing of his death would wire condolences to Mrs. Wollett that included this statement, "His interest in public affairs attracted to him a host of people who relied on him for guidance." In November of 1947 a Hammond organ and Maas chimes would be given to the church by his wife, mother, and sister in a dedication service. The Hammond organ was used until December of 1986.

It's not hard to believe that there would be a large crowd attending the funeral on that June day. But it was discovered at some point that termites had caused structural damage weakening the floor. Then there's still one more piece of information that adds to the story. On January 16, 1946 an article appeared in The News and Observer announcing the Littleton Baptist Church's formal beginning of a building campaign starting on January 20, 1946. A goal of \$20,000 was set over the next three years. Two projects would be the object of this campaign. The first was the construction of a home for the pastor, and secondly to make improvements on the church building. The house for the pastor would be dedicated on July 02, 1948 at an approximate cost of \$15,000. M. Fred Scott, Jr. would become pastor on January 01, 1951. By May 29, 1951 a building committee was appointed to make improvements to the building and to make plans for construction of a new educational annex.

It appears the church was already looking ahead. When you consider that this was right after the ending of WWII, the raising of \$20,000 was a rather large task. Seventy-five percent of the goal had been used on one part of the project. It seems a new pastor with fresh energy was needed to get things rolling again. In December of 1954 the first service was held in the new turned around sanctuary and new educational building.
