## PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

The final Sunday of the month just happens to fall on Halloween this year. During worship we will be looking at a story where King Saul makes some unwise decisions that leads to tragedy. It is the perfect story for Halloween.

We hope to see you this month in worship as we look at some strange prophets. But also I look forward to learning where you can be a change and what God is doing in your lives so that you can be more full of him.

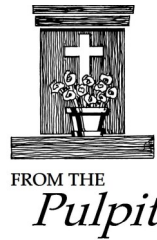
#### DEACONS MEETING
