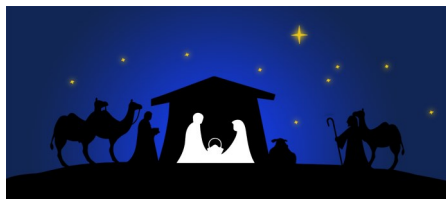

## OUR NATIVITY SCENE HISTORY

In less than one year, Littleton Baptist will celebrate 150 years of ministry. This month we feature the nativity scene ministry. Each year this beautiful lifelike Nativity Display is viewed by hundreds and allows them to see its beauty but more importantly to worship Christ.

How did it come to be? The scene came as a generous gift from two longtime members, Julian and Indie Parks, who created and designed its lifelike features in 1963. They wanted their children to understand the true meaning of Christmas. The nativity scene features life-size people and animals that were hand stitched and stuffed with hay bales. The year that the Parks made the scene, they entered a contest featuring lawn Christmas decorations and won the grand prize of \$25.00!

Every year since 2008, the nativity scene has been on display at LBC during December. It includes the stable, fence, life size camels, and sheep as well as the wise men, shepherds, and the angel. These all focus on baby Jesus in the manger surrounded by Mary and Joseph. They are all clothed in garments reminiscent of the times. It is brilliantly displayed for all who pass. In fact, at first glance, it looks alive.

What a gift which has been viewed and impacted by many. In the early years of its display, my wife Ann was in her Roanoke Rapids classroom as the children talked about Christmas when one of her students raised his hand and said, “*everybody must go to Littleton to see the wonderful Nativity Scene displayed there. It’s so real.*” He did this having no idea that his teacher was married to the pastor. The impact is far and wide and in 2018 was featured on WRAL-TV Tarheel Traveler. It can be found on the WRAL website and will be displayed on the LBC Facebook page.

We hope to continue the tradition they started by using this wonderful nativity scene so that people who drive by can understand the true meaning of Christmas. We pray that it is reminder that the birth of Christ is the reason we celebrate.

Volunteers will need to sign up for at least a one-to-two-hour period on one or more of these days. Volunteers are also needed to assist with our Christmas Party on Saturday, **December 17<sup>th</sup>** with parking, serving food, assisting Santa, and mingling with the families.
