

HISTORY OF DISASTER RECOVERY AT LBC

North Carolina Baptist started organizing disaster recovery ministry in the 1970s by what was once called the Baptist Brotherhood Department which later became the NC Baptist Men (recently changed to "Baptists on Mission"). After a disaster like a tornado or hurricane strikes an area, recovery personnel would go and assist people who needed Christ's love by cooking meals, putting tarps on houses, cleaning flooded homes... There is also a rebuild program to help victims rebuild their homes.

Littleton Baptist Church started participating in disaster recovery after Hurricane Floyd struck NC. A group from our church worked with Bear Swamp Baptist Church clearing downed trees at Princeville. Since then some of our members have been trained for disaster recovery and go help individually or with other groups. Our youth travelled to Rodanthe, NC for a few days to help with rebuilding projects after Hurricane Irene. Our church has sent groups several times to Lumberton, NC in response to Hurricanes Mathew and Florence. The farthest trip was when two members travelled to Texas in response to Hurricane Harvey.

Our church has also responded locally with home repairs, access ramp construction and workdays at the John 3:16 Center.

Special offerings have been given to support specific disaster responses and presently Littleton Baptist Church annually takes up an offering that supports NC Baptists on Mission. Many times on our Baptist Men's Day the guest speakers have people that have played a prominent role in NC Baptist on Mission. This year our guest speaker is Paul Langston who coordinates NC Baptists on Mission's rebuild program.
