PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

Miracles. That is the theme for the month of September this year. During this month, we will be looking at different miracles that we see in scripture.

My question for you is where are the miracles in your life? Do you see the miracles in the every-day? Do you see the miracle in just being able to wake up and walk? Do you see the miracle in the sun coming up in the morning?

We like reading about these big miracles in scripture, and they are wonderful. But how do you see God still working today? How do you see God performing miracles in your life? Appalachian Coalfields Christmas Outreach 2024 is a project run by NC Baptists on Mission. Their goal is to collect 22,000 backpacks of items to be distributed to Appalachian children in areas of need. Littleton Baptist would like to participate in this ministry this year.

You can help by purchasing a **NEW school backpack** that you will fill with the following items. Right now is a good time to buy backpacks.

- A) Items of **NEW warm clothing.** Please try to provide a winter hat, a pair of gloves, 2-3 pairs of win ter socks, and maybe a scarf.
- B) Small pop-top canned food items such as ravioli, tuna, beef stew, vegetables, fruit (3-4 cans no plastic containers, please)
- C) At least 1 or 2 NEW, age appropriate non-breakable toy(s) (no toy weapons, please!) This can include small cars, balls, dolls, small stuffed animals, puzzles, jump rope, sidewalk chalk, card games, Legos, etc. For oldest age group (15-17) substitute an appropriate item instead of a toy, such as, a flashlight, small thermos, light blanket, ear buds, small tool kits, fishing gear, books, hunting, fishing or sports magazines for the boys jewelry, books, ear buds, skin care products, hair accessories, small travel-sized hair dryer, etc. for the girls.
- D) Hygiene items including full sized containers of toothpaste, body wash, shampoo, and deodorant, as well as toothbrush, soap, washcloth, brush or comb. (Please fit these items into a one gallon Ziploc bag so they do not leak out into the rest of the backpack).
- **E) Fresh, wrapped candy** (no chocolate please, as it may melt; and no peanut products because of potential allergies)

<u>IMPORTANT NOTE:</u> Please make sure all items fit into the backpack. Nothing should be attached to the outside of the pack. Please stick carefully to the list above. This backpack is not for school supplies. Our mission committee is getting the Bibles for the backpacks.

Age Grouping and Labeling. Each backpack should be labeled boy or girl as well as the appropriate age. Age groupings for this year are **4-7**, **8-10**, **11-14**, **15-17**. Pin or securely tie on a label with sex of child and age of child.

We ask that you prepare your backpack as you would for your own child or grandchild, with new items, not used ones. This quality gift could be the only Christmas present this child receives, and will be a witness of Christ's love!

Please bring your backpacks to church by Sunday, October 20th.
