PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

It's true and my heart is heavy! One of every four children in America will go to bed hungry tonight. Sorry to bring that up. If you are like me, somehow it would be easier if we could just look the other way and pretend this is not true. If you're not willing to face this stark reality, you'd better stop reading this column now.

The fact still remains: 1 of every 4 of America's children will go to bed hungry every single night. As Christians we can't ignore the facts as if they were not so. The U.S. Census Bureau and the U.S. Department of Agriculture reported that in 2012, 29.2 percent of households with children are food insecure. That is confirmed in other reports as well.

In our area the statistics are even more startling. In Halifax County, 36.1 percent of all children live in poverty. Of those, 75 percent of the households are headed by women. That's the statistics, but we can't get bogged down in comparative statistics. Remember all of these children and families are creations of God and people He genuinely loves. Food insecurity is one of the clear ways the impacts of poverty show up for families. The high cost of food, lack of accessibility and other competing financial pressures leave families with difficult decisions to make and stark realities to face. The causes are many, but let us not be mistaken, children should never suffer for the misfortunate or mistakes of parents.

The above facts are hard ones to absorb. And they can be overwhelming for people who've never really been hungry. We wonder why so many have such great needs. Good questions and the answers to such are difficult and time consuming if we dare invest in seeking to understand them and be a part of the solution. Truthfully, there is no quick fix. I truly wish there was. Getting involved will demand our time and investment in people's lives. While money and resources are needed, education and building healthy relationships are even more crucial. That's where we come in to play. Are we willing to invest ourselves in this great need or will we just sit on the sidelines or maybe just contribute some cash dollars?

While this subject of children and poverty in our community can be depressing, I would say there are things we can and must do to be a part of the solution; one person and one family at a time.

- We must pray! I pray to God regularly for individuals I know in poverty and this huge social problem. Every time I seem to hear His answer, "just what are your plans Mike to become a part of the solution?" And yes, God keeps putting before me some answers. Get involved. Will what I do totally fix totally the problem? No. Will they make a difference for some of these children and families trapped in poverty? Absolutely!
- One of the best ways we can help is to support the many individuals and groups that are already working within our own communities! Advocates for children include: The John 3:16 Center, Union Mission, Pregnancy Support Center, Hannah's Place, Angel's Closet, Littleton ACTS, and many others.
- Become involved with new opportunities. "Room At the Inn" is a new program being developed in collaboration with churches and Christian agencies to address the growing problem of women and children who are homeless. I can't imagine having no place to sleep at night. (see further info elsewhere in newsletter)
- Get involved in our local schools as a volunteer to assist in their programs to help the children in their schools who are in poverty and those who are going to bed hungry. (Book Buddies, etc.)
- Become better informed and seek to better understand the issues. On Sunday, September 22 an ecumenical seminar is planned in Littleton called "Understanding Poverty." I/we have much to learn. This is a good place to start as we determine to become a part of the solution.

I'm going to keep praying and then listen to where God leads me. Can we do anything less for the sake of the children? In the name of Christ, we will strive to make a difference for the children among us. What part of the solution do you intend to be?
