## **PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH**

Thanks to the many of you who have remembered Ann and I with "fruit" from your gardens this summer; tomatoes, cucumbers, watermelon, squash, peppers, corn and so much more. It's truly been enjoyed by us and the love in which it's been offered means so very much to both of us. And that's not even mentioning the other foods you've shared during Ann's illness. Your expression of love means so much.

Speaking of gardens, one of my favorite scenes while living in Tarboro many years ago was to watch each year the employee gardens of what was then called the Sprint Corporation. Each spring I loved to watch the employees go to their designated garden spots to plant, and all summer I loved watching as the many patches of garden grew side by side to harvest. Every gardener knows a garden demands countless hours of labor but they also depend heavily upon proper sunlight and timely rainfall. In those "Sprint Gardens" I noticed that while each person did their own labor it was not unusual to see garden neighbors helping each other in their labors.

The prayers of Spirituality writer Richard Foster help me reflect on a different type garden, one he entitles, the gardener of the soul.

Spirit of the living God, be the Gardener of my soul, For so long I have been waiting, silent and still---Experiencing a winter of the soul. But now in the strong name of Jesus Christ, I dare to ask: Clear away the dead growth of the past, Break up the hard clods of custom and routine, Stir in the rich compost of vision and challenge, Bury deep in my soul the implanted Word, Cultivate and water and tend my heart, Until new life buds and opens and flowers. Amen.


