

PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

I write this article just a few short days before a mission trip to El Salvador, and on the eve of a meeting to discuss a community ministry to assist the "homeless" women and children in the Roanoke Valley. In addition, we are engaged in a Food Pantry and volunteers with John 3:16 Center and so much more. God is so good as we faithfully serve Him. - 3. Call People by Name. The sweetest music to anyone's ears is the sound of his or her own name.
- 4. Be Friendly and helpful. If you would have friends, be one.
- 5. Be Cordial. Speak and act as if everything you do is a genuine pleasure.
- **6. Be Genuinely interested in People**. If you try you can like everybody and everybody will like you. Do not limit yourself to a few friends when there are so many likeable people about you.
- 7. Be Generous with Praise, cautious with criticism. Who among us does not need the understanding and tolerance of all our friends?
- 8. Be considerate of the feeling of others. Usually there are three sides to a controversy: yours, the other person's and the right one.
- 9. Be Alert to Render Service. What we do for others counts most in life.
- 10. Add to These a Good Sense of Humor, a generous dose of patience, a dash of humility and receive manifold blessings.

You do these things well. May we continue to grow in His grace. Again, thanks for helping enable LBC to be the best we can for our Lord and Savior!!!!
