PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

As a child I remember times at night when I was afraid as I lay in the bed trying to sleep. Somehow, for whoever knows why, I thought at any moment someone might come into my window by my bed. It was unfounded because it never happened and was highly unlikely because it would have taken a large ladder to reach the bedroom window in the first place. What I remember from that is just how controlling fear can be upon our lives. It was not a good feeling then and it is not a good feeling now.

Fear can so easily consume our lives to the point that it keeps us from living life to the fullest, as is God's intention. This is true on the personal level and just as true as we live in the community. And fear today is not something dreamed up in a child's anxious imagination. It seems to be perpetuated in our society by so many things as we allow them to control us. It seems like every week there's a new reason or event trying to precipitate fear; from airport bombings to mass shootings, to political elections, to threats of many kinds like a financial crisis, or threatened fears over changes to our lifestyle and culture which can leave us uncomfortable even when we know it is right.

These fears and many more can leave us with sleepless nights and unfounded fears which hinder us from being the faithful follower of Christ who cares for all people as Jesus exemplified. The Bible reminds us again and again to "fear not"! In fact there are more than 365 specific references reminding us to not be afraid but to always remember to have faith. God is in control and faith in God always, always triumphs over fear.

A few I'll mention here and others can be found in the text box further in this newsletter.

"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." <u>Isaiah 41:10</u>

"For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind." 2 Timothy 1:7

"Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me." Psalm 23:4

"The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?" Psalm 27:1

Faith in a mighty God who is powerful over evil, faith in a God who loved the least of these, faith in a Christ who reached out to those who were unloving and sought him harm, faith amidst the most stressful moments when the deck seems so stacked against us and our own strength is inadequate to meet the needs and concerns we encounter at every turn.

I'm so glad no one every entered my bedroom window and I pray no one will inflict upon me the evil atrocities happening to some in our world. One thing for sure for those to whom they happen and to the world in which we live where fear seems so strong may we never forget that faith is stronger than fear! God is with us and we are never alone! Our Lord promised "I will never leave thee nor forsake thee."

Deacons Meeting


Our Deacons will meet on Sunday evening, **August 14**, at 7:00 P.M. in the annex.

SUPPORT UNION MISSION WITH CARDBOARD, CLOTHING AND RAG MATERIALS



While serving as your pastor and serving on the Board of the Union Mission it is clear the needs are great and the ministry invaluable to those in need. The Union Mission continues to

offer ministry to homeless men and struggling individuals through it's kitchen ministry which serves a daily meal for the community, feeds the resident men 3 meals a day and offers housing, counseling and life skills. Additionally, it's food pantry serves over 700 food boxes per month. Emergency home items and clothing is a huge part of their ministry. Additionally, a shelter for homeless women will open early next month. None of this happens without community and church support and prayer. When the needs are greatest is most often when the economy is down and financial support is at its lowest. Of course contributions great and small are appreciated, but not possible for everyone.

But there is something you can do. During the Littleton/Lake Gaston festival in our parking lot we'll also be collecting cardboard and clothing, good clothes which can be sold and not so good which will be sold for rags. All three of these sources help support the ministry of the Mission. You can bring these to our church anytime. A special station will be set up during the concurrent yard sale for the John 3:16 Center. Your help makes a huge difference! Spread the word!
