## PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

I LOVE THE BIBLE! It's God's divinely inspired Word helping us with the living of our days on this earth. A study of how we got our Bible over all those centuries by over 40 writers is astounding and spiritually heartwarming. That's why I read, study, and meditate upon its many pages each and every day, though honestly and regretfully, sometimes more intensely at times than others. I suspect we all can say this.

I do love the Bible, God's own word to us. It reveals who God is, who we are, and why we are here. Through Bible study we gain insights into God, human nature and creation! Studying the Scripture can equip, guide and reveal how to live in life-giving ways that deepen our friendship with God and others. Both the Old and New Testaments encourage regular study, meditation, and memorization of the Bible. Its benefits are directly related to how open, attentive and obedient we are to what we read.

It's a big question for us to consider. What does the Bible "really" mean in my daily walk with Christ?

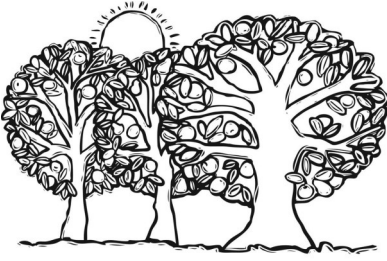
While in seminary many years ago (I graduated in 1980), many extremely con-

servative Baptist Christians became highly critical of many of the bible teachings of my excellent and Godly professors. These were men and women I had observed were deeply devoted to its message and meaning for life. They devoted their lives to studying and teaching The Bible. I was saddened to say the least. Recently I purchased a new book by the president of my seminary who was at the center of the controversy. I'd listened to Dr. Randall Lolley and knew his devotion to the Bible and the professors he was forced to vehemently defend. A few years after I graduated those who criticized gained leadership control of the trustees which guided the institution and Dr. Randall Lolley was forced to step down as he stood by the professors and their deeply held beliefs. That's why I was so thrilled with one my newest book purchases. Dr. Lolley in these later years of his life, at the encouragement of some former students, has compiled a book entitled "Journey with Me: Redemptive Threads Woven Through the Bible". This is a year long collection of sermons from each book of the Bible he preached at First Bap-

tist Church, Greensboro in 1995-96 where he served after his resignation from seminary. Each sermon gives an inspiring understanding of each Bible book and its application for our life. An excellent tool for any Christian hungry for more depth in their understanding of God's Word. Royalties from all sales will benefit the Lolley Fund for Theological Education, an initiative of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina Endowment Trust. This fund assists deserving divinity students pursuing theological education which is a worthy cause to which Lolley has devoted his life. If interested I'll share my copy for review and even order a copy for you. Cost is \$18.00 and can also be ordered from Amazon and other places or \$9.99 on kindle. A good read with a cause for anyone desiring to go deeper in this comprehensive overview of the Written Word of God. 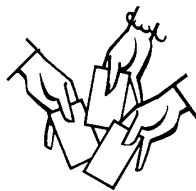

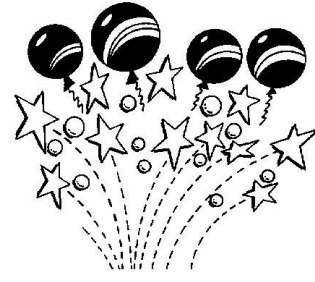
