IN MEMORY

For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in him should not perish but have everlasting life. John 3:16

PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

John opens his gospel with a description of Jesus, "In the beginning was the Word and the word was God." He writes in versus 14 "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." Luke gives the most detailed account of the first Christmas as he describes Jesus miraculous birth in Bethlehem to Mary and Joseph in a stable because there was no room in the inn. Since early times following his birth, Christians have found diverse ways to celebrate this holy birth; sometimes in significant and holy ways; and at other times in ways much less holy and significant.

The Season of Advent to Christmas is the appropriate time to do a self check regarding just how we celebrate the birth of our Savior and its meaning to us, our families, and our world. How do you define Christmas by what you say and what you do?

Spirituality writer Henri Nouwen once defined Christmas this way: "Songs, good feelings, beautiful liturgies, nice presents, big dinners, and sweet words do not make Christmas. Christmas is saying yes to something beyond all emotions and feelings. Christmas is saying yes to a hope based on God's initiative, which has nothing to do with what I think or feel. Christmas is believing that the salvation of the world is God's work and not mine." {Henry Nouwen, New Oxford Review (Nov. 1986)}

I wonder if we were to write a definition of Christmas, what might it include? I'm sure for many it would be filled with the birth of Christ and our eternal hope for salvation and testimony regarding a loving God who sent His One and only Son into our world to bring salvation for all people. These words are not only important, but the essence of Christmas.

However Christmas is defined not only by words on a page, but most importantly by the way we live and celebrate this great truth in our lives. "If someone were to write a definition of Christmas by your action during this holiday season, just what would that definition include?" My fear is much of it could likely be filled with things like activity, greed, hurry, stress, and busyness. How tragic!

My prayer for each of you during this season is that your celebration of this holy season will not be defined by such things, but more by His presence being "fleshed out" through worship, giving, serving, proclaiming this good news to all we have opportunity.

While activity is vital to our Christmas celebration as we express our great joy through worship, music, doing good deeds and devoting ample time for family and Christian fellowship, let us always remember the why of Christmas! Christmas is "saying ves to a hope based on God's initiative," and "believing that the salvation of the world is God's work and not mine." Christmas means making room for Him to enter our hearts and lives and to lead us down Christ's path of truth and life. Christmas allows this truth to permeate everything we say and do before others as we express this heartfelt love and devotion for our Christ who loves us so.

Just what will your "fleshed out" definition include during Advent and Christmas, 2016?
