While I may be able to assist the pastor on some occasions, the leadership can and must be theirs. The very best thing you can do for me is pray for them and allow them that place.

I ask you also to pray for Ann and me in our changing roles. We both will be busy with the work of the Union Mission and seeking to find more time for us to enjoy retirement and a bit of travel.
