REFLECTIONS ...

This month's newsletter may sound a little different than previous ones. After many years of serving as pastor of Littleton Baptist, Mike Currin retired on January 1^{st} . I am filling in this month with reflections on a big event in my personal life this past month and where I plan to go from here (if it's God's plan).

As many of you know, I have been attending Littleton Baptist Church since I was sixteen years old. I went to Campbell University, graduating in 2013 with a BA in History. I plan to graduate this May from Campbell University Divinity School with a Master of Divinity degree. When I first came to Campbell, I planned to become a pharmacist (like many who go to Campbell), but I knew deep down that I hated chemistry. I became a history major and sometime during my sophomore year, I became uncomfortable with where my faith was and the direction my life was going. I enjoyed history and loved God, and yet something was off. The more I thought about it, I began to realize I enjoyed missions and service work. Maybe God was calling me to go to Divinity School. Like Jacob, I wrestled with God. I did NOT want to become a preacher. I hate speaking in front of large groups and while I enjoy studying and learning, I did not like the sound of having to prepare a sermon every week. I decided instead of becoming a history professor, God must want me to be a Church history or Bible professor. In order to do that, one has to know Greek and Hebrew, so I took both (and now I only remember the basics).

My trajectory in ministry changed in the summer of 2015 when I completed what is called a Clinical Pastoral Education internship at WakeMed in Raleigh. I served as (and learned how to be) a hospital chaplain in an eleven week intensive unit. I had so many wonderful experiences and quite a few tragic ones while there. I met a family whose matriarch was battling dementia and starting to have more bad days than good ones. Going door to door making hospitality visits on a slower than normal day, I entered a seemingly healthy patient's room right after the doctor walked out from giving a terminal cancer diagnosis. I watched doctors unsuccessfully perform CPR on a grandfather as his daughter and granddaughter wept and pleaded with God for their loved one to be brought back to life. I sat with a single mother in the wee hours of the night/early morning as she grieved the loss of her child. I attempted to be present at the bedside of a man who fell asleep at the wheel while he heard the horrible noises of the doctors trying the resuscitate his friend who had been riding in the passenger seat.

Amidst the tragedy, there was the man given a second chance on life after driving his truck into a ditch. There was the love of a worried mother, working to get all of the help she could for her son whom she had found hours earlier after an attempted suicide. There was the immigrant child whose father found him at the bottom of the pool after being under the water for 15 minutes. There was the attempting to explain that the police were coming to figure out the details, and having to run back and forth from the family to the other traumas that continued to come into the hospital. There was the miraculous recovery as the child who in no way should have lived or have brain function was sitting up coloring, eating breakfast, and talking to his mother three days later.

These experiences, along with the guidance of my supervisor and peers, helped me to find my gifts and my passion for chaplaincy work. On Sunday, January 22nd, I was ordained into the Christian ministry in a beautiful worship service at Littleton Baptist, and I am so thankful to all who participated and those who helped with the reception. I am thankful for the love and prayers for me from all of you. I am thankful for the church family who helped to make my family feel welcomed into the Littleton Baptist Church family. I ask for your prayers as I hear back from hospitals on February 22nd about their year-long residency positions as I take the next step in the journey of becoming a hospital chaplain. Pray that as I follow God's call to ministry as one "set apart," I continue to grow as a Christian and as a minister.




