THOUGHTS ALONG THE WAY

Today, I want to give you some background for what I plan to do in our service on May 21. For background, I want to take you back with me to my final year in college.

My first two years in college were at Mars Hill College, north of Asheville. This North Carolina Baptist college was, at that time, a junior college. Now, it is a four-year university. In order to finish my college education, I had to enroll in another school. I chose Howard College, now Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama. Samford is also a Baptist school. I majored in Sociology, with a minor in Speech and Drama. The founder and head of the Speech and Dramatic Arts Department was Dr. G. Allan Yeomans. Dr. Yeomans was not only an excellent professor, but also a friend and role model for his students. We were very blessed to study under him.

During my senior year, Dr. Yeomans directed a production based on the book, *God's Trombones*, by James Weldon Johnson. The book is a collection of a prayer and seven African-American sermons each being a composite of the style of the old-time Negro preacher. The production involved my fellow students and I sharing the prayer and sermons.

Our venue for the production was the Dawson Memorial Baptist Church in Birmingham. The church is a very large structure, with the Baptistry located halfway up the wall behind the pulpit. My part in the production was the first sermon, *The Creation*, which followed the opening prayer. A platform had been built in the Baptistry and I stood on that, dressed in a black robe, enveloped in a gold light.

Little did I know at that time that I would act out that sermon scores of times in my adult life. It has been a staple in the programs Betty and I have done for senior adults in North Carolina, South Carolina, Maryland and Virginia.

One other part of the presentation is a musical background which Dr. Yeomans selected to go with *The Creation*. The selection is Dvorak's Symphony No. 9 "From the New World." I never cease to be amazed at how well it fits the sermon. It is almost as though Dvorak wrote it to be the background music.

Because I love the sermon and the music, and because I love the Littleton Baptist *Family of Faith*, I wanted to share *The Creation* with you. I hope that you will be able to be present on Sunday, May 21, and invite others. Of course, I want to see you before then, as well.

I just wanted to take the time to truly thank everyone for their thoughts, meals, cards, prayers and support they provided, not only myself, but Til as well during this past year. Also critical was the handicap ramp the men and women of the Church, along with a few others, built and took down. That was a Godsend for me. Thank you so much. As you may or may not know, last May I was admitted to WakeMed for Sepsis (Septic Shock.) Til was told by several doctors that they had never seen anyone as critically sick as I was when I arrived. After two admissions to the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), the doctor in charge at one point told Til initially that it looked like I might need surgery and that I may not survive the operation. She suggested to Til that she should call the family post haste before she operated. Sooo, my children received that infamous, dreadful call in the middle of the night to which they immediately responded to be at my bedside. My daughter and her husband drove in from Asheville, and my son made the trip from Seattle. Ironically, the operation was not necessary at that time since my condition had miraculously improved. It did take place a month later but was considered non-life threatening at that point. Well the rest of the story is basically history. I survived multiple operations without any complications, improving daily and back to a 75 - 80% capability. I credit my survival solely to the prayers you offered our Lord. I thank each of you so much. I can't say that I felt the Lord's presence at the time, but reflecting back on it I can clearly see that it was He whose hands I was in. Praise be to God!
