## THOUGHTS ALONG THE WAY

### *Singing in the Rain*

As I look back on it, I was very fortunate that my family moved to Greenville when I was a ten-year-old. At that time, East Carolina University was called East Carolina Teachers' College, or ECTC. (Always, I have loved the ring of those letters.) The relationship between the college and the community was a very close one - to the benefit of both. Many opportunities came my way as a result of that close relationship. Not the least of which involved the cultural opportunities. I shall be grateful - always.

We lived on Library Street - a few blocks from the college in one direction, and a few blocks from the Tar River in the other.

I had several jobs during my teen years. The job that lasted the longest, when I saved the most, and which I enjoyed the most was delivering *The Daily Reflector*. I served the homes on three streets: Library, Eastern, and Lewis. In those days, the paperboy collected the money from each customer, so I was seeing my customers each month and becoming friends with them. I had a large basket mounted on the front of my bicycle from which I delivered each paper. *The Daily Reflector*, being an afternoon paper, was perfect for a high school student to deliver when school let out. Its offices and printing presses were only a few blocks from Greenville High School. Once I picked up the papers, it did not take me too long to pedal to my route on the three streets and begin delivering.

Most times the weather was fairly good. I could get along with the cold, as well as the heat, but the rain was quite another story. My priority was keeping the papers dry. Nobody likes a wet newspaper. I still don't. Rain slowed down my delivery time because I had to stop at each house to put the paper in a dry place.

As I shared, briefly, in my message on July 16, on rainy days, to avoid being a sad paperboy, I would sing hymns on my route. I chose uplifting hymns such as *Higher Ground*, *Love Lifted Me*, *On Jordan's Stormy Banks I Stand*, and *Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus*. The harder it rained, the louder I sang. Not only did this practice lift my spirits, but it made the job go so much faster. I know Gene Kelley made a lot more money with his rendition of *Singing in the Rain*, but my practice helped get me through.
