Where Does Your Money Go?

There are so many 'good causes' these days that people have a hard time figuring out where to give. The following is information about three missions that our church supports.

There are a lot of toy drives during the Christmas season and collecting the toys is really the easy part. Distributing the toys to the needy children is the hard part. The John 3:16 Center interview families and find out their needs in toys and clothing. Then the Center tries to get the parents to select the right presents to avoid duplication of gifts. At the Christmas party while the children are visiting Santa, the parents

sneak out back and get the wrapped presents they selected. Many parents are embarrassed if someone goes to their house and gives their children toys. The way the Center handles the distribution the parents have the feeling they are providing for their children.

This past year there have been quite a few disasters and it has kept the NC Baptist Men busy. Our Church not only took up a special offering for the disasters, but eight people representing our church participated in disaster relief at four different sites in 2017. Here are the NCBM statistics for 2017 as of November:

18 responses 128 homes rebuilt (Hurricane Matthew)

30,000 volunteer days 15,118 Showers 91 Salvations 3,072 laundry loads

540.000 meals prepared 861 recovery jobs completed

13,000+ gallons of potable water through water purification

WRAL TV recently did a story on "One year after Hurricane Mathew". It interviewed many folks still struggling to get back into their homes after being flooded. Then the reporter interviewed Billy Layton of the Baptist Men and he told them how they are still rebuilding homes and will continue for a while. After the initial response most disaster relief groups leave town. The Baptist Men continue to serve Christ by rebuilding homes, lives and sharing the gospel.

Our church received a message that a 90 year old lady near Airlie needed railings on her handicapped ramp. Volunteers from our church responded and installed rails, bumpers and fixed a few areas. The money for materials came from our fellowship fund that we collect after every communion service.

Our church family deserves a big thanks for sharing Christ's love in offerings and service. May we reach out to many more people in 2018.
