THREE LITTLE WORDS

I remember the song quite well, *Three Little Words*. The month of February seemed a good time to shine the spotlight on those words: *I love you*. Wikipedia provided me a lot of information that I didn't know. The music was written by Harry Ruby and the lyrics by Bert Kalmar. It was published in 1930, and was recorded by *The Rhythm Boys* (including Bing Crosby), and accompanied by the Duke Ellington Orchestra on August 2, 1930. In 1950, it was the title of a movie starring Fred Astaire, Debbie Reynolds and Red Skelton.

When I was a boy, my mother would ask me the question: How much do you love me? My standard response became: A whole space full! This was said with hands extended as far as possible on either side. At a very early age, we learn to sing such words as, Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so; Jesus loves the little children, all the children of the world; and O how I love Jesus.

In the English language, we have one word to express the emotion of *love*. In Greek, there are four: agape, eros, philia, and storge. We say, *I love desserts, I love to sleep late, I love to watch basketball, I love to watch the snow fall, I love my wife, I love my children, I love the smell of a new car. I could go on, but you get the point. We use the word <i>love* in countless ways to express countless types of love.

Valentine's Day is fast approaching. On this day, we try, by some card, gift, or special dinner, to express our love for someone. It is the way that we express, in a tangible way, what we feel in our heart.

One of my favorite passages in the New Testament is found in I John 4:7-8.

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God.

Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love.

Not only is God love, and the Source of love, but love is the true test of a believer.

It does not take long to discover that love permeates the Littleton Baptist *family of faith*. Not only do you share it among yourselves, but you give it to others. We know, and we love you. HAPPY VALENTINE'S DAY!
