# THOUGHTS ALONG THE WAY 

## A WEEKEND OF CONTRASTS

I am writing this on Friday evening, May $18^{\text {th }}$. For several days this week the morning television programs have been preparing us for The Royal Wedding. We have seen the beauty of Windsor and have anticipated the elegance of the wedding of Meghan Markle and Prince Harry. It is not likely to disappoint, though I do not plan to get up tomorrow at 4:30 a.m. for the opening coverage. I'm quite sure the event will be replayed many times during the day. Excitement seemed to be the order of the day this morning, and will "go out the top" tomorrow.

Then, the same morning, we were taken to the Santa Fe High School, scene of the tragic death of nine students, one teacher and the injuring of ten more, at the hands of a 17 -year-old boy. He was armed with a shotgun and a hand gun. In addition to his ever-present black trench coat, he wore on Facebook a black T-shirt with the chilling message, Born to Kill. His plan of mass murder included the planting of several homemade bombs in the school and surrounding area. It is hard for us to imagine a mind so filled with hate that the decision was made to end the lives of fellow students. Though, at the end of his massacre he planned to take his own life, he could not carry that through.

ABC News reports that there have been 31 school shootings in the US since Columbine in 1999, when 13 people were killed. That means that all the young people in Santa Fe High School have never known a time in their lives when there were not school shootings. That is no way to grow up. Adults reading this did not grow up that way either.

I call it A Weekend of Contrasts, and so it has been. A weekend of euphoria in Windsor, and a weekend of unbearable tragedy in Santa Fe, Texas. We have good news and bad news in the extremes. Of course, the impact of both will be unending.

We call the Gospel, Good News. It is that, and that was the message of the angels to the shepherds outside Bethlehem. We need to remember, however, that our Gospel is for all time. Not only did our Savior come, but he remains with us. He overcame sin and death, and, in him we have the victory as well. That is very Good News. It is Good News to a world lost in sin. It is Good News when the way seems dark.

Let us be reminded that, in one weekend we had the crucifixion and the resurrection. The contrast could not be greater. Ultimately, the Good News will always out-weigh the bad.

## C.A.R.E./THE JOHN 3:16 CENTER STOCK THE CLASSROOM

Each year the John 3:16 Center has had a school supply drive where parents had appointments to receive supplies. The Center would give as many items on the child's specific list as they could; however, they were not able to meet all of their supply needs. Supplies cost about $\$ 50$ per child each year, including an inexpensive book bag. This cost is higher for children in need of a graphing calculator. Many of the parents were having to attend other school supply events in the community in order to get all the supplies their children needed. This year the Center will be working with other area organizations to make an even bigger impact in our community. Instead of stocking individual students, they will be stocking full classrooms. Through their "Stock the Classroom" campaign, every child in the classroom will be fully prepared to learn on their first day of school. Teachers will also be able to spend more time assessing the needs of their students on those critical first days of school instead of unpacking the needed supplies. They will begin collecting items on Wednesday, June 21, through Tuesday, August 1, with the goal of stocking as many classrooms as possible. New or gently used uniforms will also be collected and distributed as they have in the past.
