THOUGHTS ALONG THE WAY A PRICELESS GIFT

A young boy was given a candy bar. It was his favorite. All of a sudden, the lesson of sharing went out the window when a friend asked for a bite. The response was, “No, this is my candy bar and you can’t have any.” If, as Americans, we treat freedom as our “candy bar,” and deny a bite to others in our world who yearn for it, indeed, are desperate for it, we cease to be the kind of people who gave birth to this nation with the *Declaration of Independence*.

Throughout our history, we have prided ourselves as being the “Home of the brave, and the land of the free.” No doubt, all of us are familiar with the words of Emma Lazarus, American Poet and native of New York, NY. The words are inscribed on a bronze plaque in the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty.

*Give me your tired, your poor,
Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore,
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tossed, to me:
I lift my lamp beside the golden door.*

It is difficult for us to imagine the hardships endured by those seeking refuge and freedom in this land. They deserve our compassion, prayers and our hospitality. Normally, I choose not to take sides on political issues, but, as has been pointed out by so many—the current situation is a moral issue.

In reality, the document known as the *Declaration of Independence* is a priceless gift from our forefathers. It is all about freedom and independence. You may not know that Thomas Jefferson, the main author of the *Declaration*, was the youngest member of the Second Continental Congress. Five men were charged with the task of writing the *Declaration of Independence*, but Jefferson was chosen because he was a good writer. If he didn’t do a good job, or present well-developed ideas, his age could have worked against him. For that reason, his age was his first obstacle.

His second obstacle was developing an acceptable draft. He would complete a draft, not like it, and start over at *square one*. Getting it just right was a really big challenge because Jefferson had so many ideas and he wanted to include them all. Finally, the last draft was ready to submit for revision. Both Benjamin Franklin and John Adams had suggestions for changes. Remember now, this was being done in Philadelphia in hot June and early July, without benefit of air conditioning.

With the *Fourth of July* celebration of parades and barbecues, let us remember that our freedom is a priceless gift, and give thanks.
