PASTOR'S PARAGRAPH

Have you noticed that it's beginning to look a lot like Christmas everywhere you go! From the shopping centers, in our homes all decked out in beautiful array, to the very church in which we worship each Sunday! It's a special time of year! Enjoy it!

As we begin this month, a "one of a kind" Nativity Scene will grace our church yard and a beautiful Chrismon Tree our sanctuary, along with an Adwreath, a beautiful vent Christmas banner, and beautiful decor. While much of our attention of Christmas will focus on shopping for gifts for one another and friends gathering for parties and food: Christians know that Advent and Christmas are a different time of year. At church the decor and the special worship are designed to turn to the message of Christ and His great love for us!

Spirituality writer Henri Nouwen once defined Christmas this way: "Songs, good feelings, beautiful liturgies, nice presents, big dinners, and sweet words do not make Christmas. Christmas is saying yes to something beyond all emotions and feelings. Christmas is saying yes to a

hope based on God's initiative, which has nothing to do with what I think or feel. Christmas is believing that the salvation of the world is God's work and not mine." (Henry Nouwen, New Oxford Review (Nov., 1986))

I wonder if we were to write a definition of Christmas, what would it include? I'm sure for most, it would be filled with the birth of Christ and our eternal hope for salvation and testimony regarding a loving God who sent His One and only Son into our world to bring salvation for all people. These words are not only important, but the essence of Christmas.

Unfortunately for most in our world however, is that Christmas is not defined by words on a page, but rather by the way Christians live and celebrate this great truth in their lives. "If someone were to write a definition of Christmas by your action during this season, what would that definition include?" My fear is much of it would likely be filled with things like activity, greed, hurry, stress, and busyness. How tragic! My prayer for each of you during this season is that your celebration of this holy season will

not be defined by such things, but by His presence being "fleshed out" through worship and in all your relationships.

While activity is vital to our Christmas celebration as we express our great joy through worship, music, doing good deeds and devoting ample time for family and Christian fellowship, let us always remember the why of Christmas! Christmas is "saying yes to a hope based on God's initiative," and "believing that the salvation of the world is God's work and not mine." Christmas means making room for Him to enter our hearts and lives and to lead us down Christ's path of truth and life. Christmas allows this truth to permeate everything we say and do before others as we express this heartfelt love and devotion for our Christ who loves us so.


Our Deacons will meet on Sunday evening, <u>December 1</u> at 7:00 PM in the Annex Conference Room.
