

The John 3:16 Center has been incredibly blessed to serve so many during this unprecedented time. The faithfulness of donors has afforded their organization to consistently fulfill an essential need for our community. Food insecurity has presented itself as a concern for many of our local families.

Non-perishable food items, such as canned vegetables, fruits, peanut butter, jelly, tuna, canned chicken, tuna helper, pancake mix, pancake syrup, cereal, grits, breakfast bars, macaroni and cheese and soups.

Perishable items such as fresh apples, oranges and vegetables.

Activities for children including crafts, coloring books, basketballs, Frisbees, etc.

Small boxes (approximately 12"x16"x10") or similar.

Disinfectant spray.
