One of these that peaked my interest was a backpack project in West Virginia that was in the Baptist on Missions in NC Magazine. Then Betty

Anne Shearin called about the same article. I hope you will enjoy this project. Get children involved. Have fun.

Items needed:

A back pack (There are some in vestibule) filled with the following seven items:

1. Hats, gloves, scarves or similar items
2. Three or four pop top canned foods - beef stew, mac and cheese, fruit, veggies, tuna
3. Hygiene items-toothpaste, toothbrush, body-wash, shampoo, deodorant, soap, washcloth, hair brush, comb (wet or liquid items should be packed in plastic bags)
4. Fresh wrapped carry-on - No chocolate or peanuts
5. Children's Bible placed in front pocket
6. The Christmas Story. This is being printed by Mike and Betty Blanton.
7. Four age groups. Pick your preferred age and boy or girl. Ages 4-7, 8-10, 11-14, 15-17. Younger children, 4 to 14, one or two new toys-small stuffed animal, small cars, balls, yo-yo, jump rope, sidewalk chalk, card games, Legos. Older children ideas are (girls) jewelry, books, skincare products, hair accessories (boys) flashlight, thermos, light blanket, books, hunting/fishing magazines.

The backpacks should be delivered to the church by **Sunday, October 25**. Label boy or girl and age group. This will be done using 15" colored ribbons. Pink for girls, blue for boys. Age group colors are 4-7 yellow, 8-10 green, 11-14 red and 15-17 white. There will be ribbons provided with the backpacks.

Dollar Tree and Wal-Mart have large selections for many of the wanted items. If you prefer to make a donation to LBC and let others do the shopping, let us know as soon as possible. Our youth might enjoy a Pack A Backpack Party.

Pray over your chosen backpack and have fun doing something special for children this fall.
